Pursuant to the California Public Records Act § 6250 et seq., I hereby request the following records:

Copies of all applications for the pay to stay inmate program that were granted from 2013 to present.

I am requesting that you waive all applicable fees associated with this request because release of this information is in the public interest, as it will contribute significantly to public understanding of government operations and activities. As a reporter for The Marshall Project, a nonprofit news outlet focused on criminal justice that has published articles in the New York Times, the Washington Post, and other major outlets, I am making this request as a member of the media. This request is not for commercial use. If you deny this request for a fee waiver, please advise me in advance of the estimated charges associated with fulfilling this request. Please send me a detailed and itemized explanation of those charges.

The California Public records Act requires that public records responses be made within at least 10 business days. If access to the records I am requesting will take longer than the time allotted by law, please contact me.

If you deny any or all of this request, please cite each specific exemption you feel justifies the refusal to release the information and notify me of the appeal procedures available to me under the law.

In the interest of expediency, and to minimize the research and/or duplication burden on your staff, please send records electronically if possible. If this is not possible, please notify me before sending to the address listed below my signature (the address on this business letterhead is outdated). Thank you for talking to me just now. To recap our conversation: I received a response in the mail about my records request for:

"A breakdown of the people convicted of crimes that have opted for the city's "pay to stay jail program," including the person's name, conviction, total amount paid, total days served in a pay to stay jail, and dates incarcerated. Please include this information for the years 2013 to present."

This request was largely denied because the city said there "is no document that identified the compilation of information that you seek." I would like to make a new request to deal with this. In the attached PDF, you will find the Anaheim Police Department's pay to stay inmate application (on page 4). In a word document, I have attached a new request for copies of all of the applications that were granted from 2013 to present.
