To Whom It May Concern:

This letter constitutes a request under the California Public Records Act (“CPRA”) by the Electronic Frontier Foundation (“EFF”) for records related to Anaheim’s use of Vigilant Solutions Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR). EFF seeks these records as part of its Street Level Surveillance project, which works to obtain government records and documents and make those records widely available to the public.

The City of Anaheim Police Department currently manages a cross-jurisdictional ALPR program, with Vigilant Solutions (formerly Vigilant Video) as the main contractor.

We request the following records:

- All contracts, purchasing orders, memorandums of understanding, terms of use, licensing agreements, or other agreements with Vigilant Solutions/Vigilant Video.

We do not seek physical copies of these records and would prefer the documents be transmitted via email for the sake of efficiency and the conservation of natural and government resources. If it is necessary to deliver the records on a CD-ROM, we ask that you waive any fees as EFF is a nonprofit organization that makes all information it receives through records requests available to the public. As you are aware, CPRA allows you to charge actual copying costs, but no costs associated with overhead or staff time.

Please notify me within 10 days of receipt of this letter whether the request, in whole or in part, will be granted. Should you claim an exemption from CPRA for all or part of this request, please indicate in writing the statutory basis for the exemption and explain why the public interest favors your denial of the request. We believe that exemptions and redaction will be unnecessary since we are only seeking information already in the public domain.
