



Storm evacuations

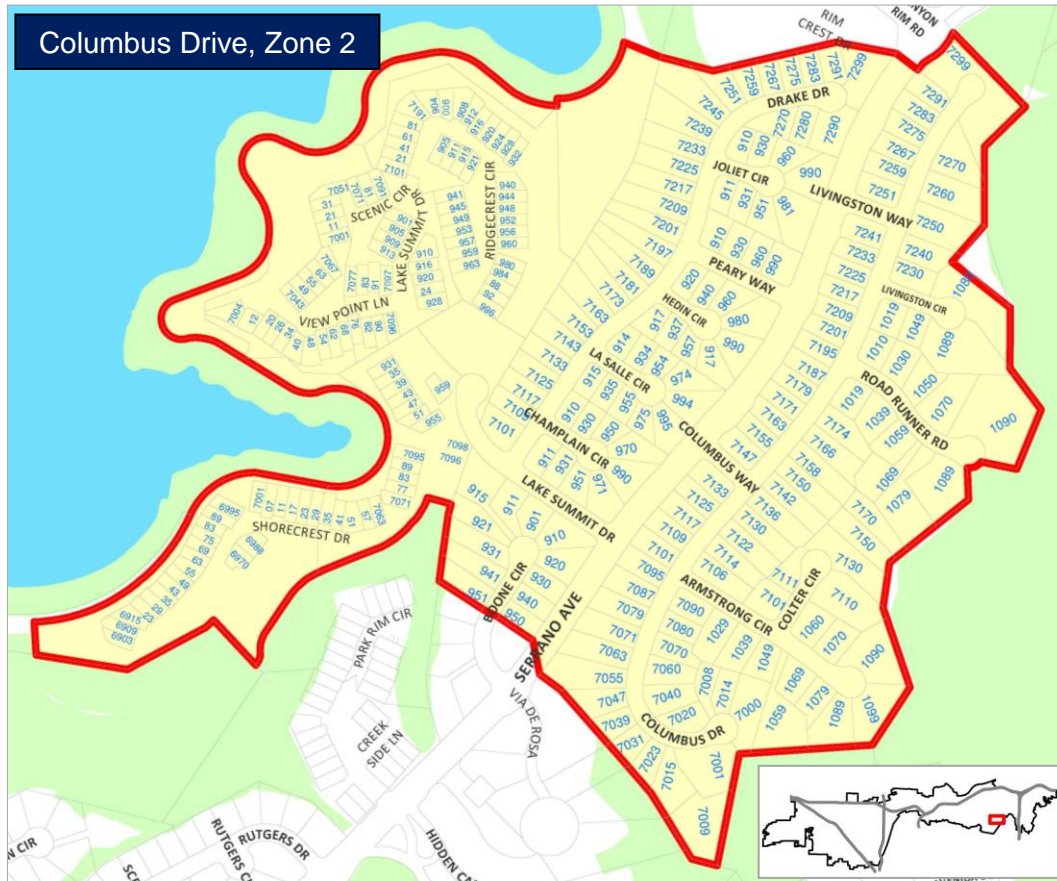
- **What:** voluntary evacuations of east Anaheim neighborhoods near hillsides burned in Canyon Fire 2 in October
- **Where:** three neighborhoods east of Serrano Avenue, alongside slopes and hillsides
- **Why:** out of an abundance of caution to protect residents from possible mud and debris flow from hillsides burned in Canyon Fire 2
- **Who's impacted:** 395 homes, estimated 1,280 residents
- **Neighborhoods:**
 - Blue Sky Road, evacuation zone 1
 - Columbus Drive, evacuation zone 2
 - Overlook Terrace, evacuation zone 3
- **Blue Sky Road:** between Weir Canyon Road to the north and Silver Star Way to the south
 - Homes: 90
 - Estimated residents: 315
 - Evacuation routes: S. Weir Canyon Road and S. Country Glen Way
 - Addresses:

- **Columbus Drive:** between Walnut Canyon Reservoir to the west and hillsides to the east, from Canyon Rim Road to the north and just before Hidden Canyon Road to the south
 - Homes: 290
 - Estimated residents: 930
 - Evacuation routes: north and south on Serrano Avenue, E. Canyon Rim Road

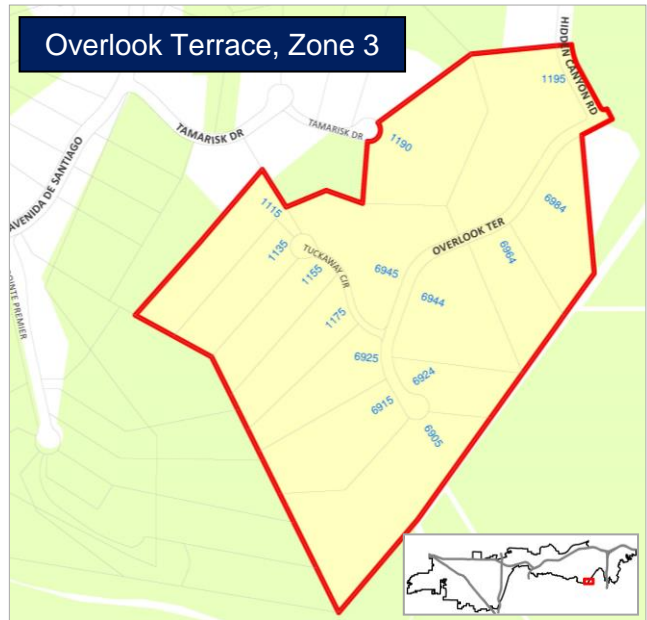

- **Overlook Terrace:** from Hidden Canyon Road to the north to just south of Overlook Terrace

- Homes: 14
- Estimated residents: 34
- Evacuation route: S. Hidden Canyon Road and south on Serrano Avenue

- **Evacuation center:** East Anaheim Community Center, 8201 E. Santa Ana Canyon Road, is serving as a care and reception center for anyone who needs a place to go during the day
 - **Hours:** Wednesday, March 21 at 1 p.m. to Thursday, March 22 at 5 p.m. or as needed
 - **Phone number:** (714) 765-3903
- **Evacuation duration:** conditions will determine when any potential evacuation is lifted with a goal of getting people back in their homes as early as possible, as early as Thursday evening or Friday morning
- **Onsite:** always follow the onsite direction of Anaheim Police, Fire & Rescue and other city officials for evacuations and other emergencies
- **Updates:** follow updates from the city of Anaheim at [Facebook.com/cityofanaheim](https://www.facebook.com/cityofanaheim) and [Twitter.com/city_of_anaheim](https://twitter.com/city_of_anaheim) and watch for text messages via Anaheim Alert
- **Mud, debris flow:** we do not expect major mud and debris flow into neighborhoods but it is *always possible* with heavy rains in areas with burnt hillsides
- **Preparation:** Anaheim Public Works has been clearing storm drains, checking water pumps and distributing sandbags in the Canyon Fire 2 burn area and across the city ahead of the storm
- **Earlier preparation:** In late 2017, Canyon Fire 2 hillsides were seeded with new growth providing added stability to the top layers of soil, shortly after concrete barriers were installed along Blue Sky Road to slow any debris flow
