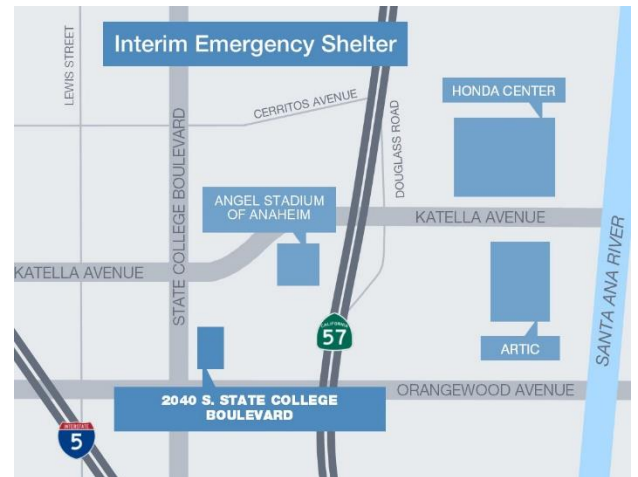




# FactSheet

## Interim Emergency Shelter

- **What:** interim emergency homeless shelter
- **Opened:** Dec. 20, 2018
- **Beds:** 200
- **Residents:** 190 to 200 as of late January
  - **Dec. 20, 2019:** 40 residents
  - **First week:** 130 residents
  - **Second week:** 150 residents
  - **Late January:** about 200 residents



- **Residents there since opening:** 70 percent

- **Where:** 2040 S. State College Blvd.

- **Why:**

- Allows Anaheim to help those in during critical winter months before additional shelter space comes online
- Allows Anaheim to address growing impacts of homelessness on city parks, streets and neighborhoods
- Part of effort to provide shelter space under settlement of Orange County Catholic Worker lawsuit against county of Orange, Anaheim and others



- **Space:** 27,000 square feet within empty, 110,000-square-foot industrial building

- **Timeline:**

- **Dec. 7, 2018:** construction start
- **Dec. 20, 2018:** opening
- **March 15, 2019:** shelter end date



# FactSheet

## 2040 S. State College Blvd.

- **Cost:** no more than \$1.4 million for buildout, operation; \$761,458 as of late January
- **Funding:** city funding with business community contributions
- **Operational period:** up to 90 days with maximum one-month extension, or until the opening of two the Kraemer Emergency Shelter and Salvation Place shelter
- **Serving:** homeless referred by Anaheim's outreach workers, Anaheim Police, Orange County Health Care Agency, others dealing with homelessness in the city
- **Features:**
  - Family living space
  - Men's, women's living spaces
  - Single beds, individual nightstands
  - Covered outdoor space
  - Wireless internet
  - Dining area, kitchen
  - Lounge area with TV
  - Transportation service four times a day
  - Personal storage space
  - Pets, outdoor dog run
  - Inspirational murals
- **Operator:** Orange-based Illumination Foundation
- **Onsite employees:** 30

### Illumination Foundation

- **What:** nonprofit working to prevent homelessness, transition families and others living in homelessness to housing
- **Founded:** 2007
- **Headquarters:** Orange
- **Housing office:** Stanton
- **Services:** weekly outreach, case management, medical care, mental health and workforce services, emergency, transitional and permanent housing
- **Shelters, facilities:** 16
- **Locations:** Orange County, Los Angeles, Inland Empire
- **Anaheim:**
  - **2014:** Illumination Foundation starts program with Anaheim, Anaheim Union High School District to identify homeless students and provide services and housing to their families
  - **2015:** identified, placed families at Rockwood Apartments, an Anaheim community with supportive services for formerly homeless families and others that opened in 2016

## 2040 S. State College Blvd.

- **Security:** 24-hour onsite security, inside and outside
- **Police:** Anaheim Police patrols, responds and oversees security to ensure public safety and minimal impact on surrounding areas
- **Partnership:** project is a partnership of Anaheim and Visit Anaheim Cares, which provided space for shelter
- **Visit Anaheim Cares:** nonprofit community service arm of Visit Anaheim, Anaheim's destination marketing organization
- **Why:** Visit Anaheim markets, sells and develops Anaheim as a visitor destination and wants to do its part to give back to the community
- **Business funding:** about \$350,000 in financial commitments, in-kind donations
