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Development of the draft security plan included:

- Incorporation of proven, established Community Policing & Problem Solving strategies
- Input from police chiefs / command staff from Orange County law enforcement agencies



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Collaboration with Neighboring Law Enforcement

- Partner with neighboring law enforcement, including Orange P.D., to collaboratively work with residents to address and prevent problems and be responsive to their concerns.
- Expand Homeless Collaborative to incorporate Orange PD's Homeless Engagement & Resource Team (HEART)



Collaboration, cont.

- Regular joint outreach and enforcement efforts
- Sharing of Information
- Collaboration to Include the Shelter Operator, and other agencies / service providers



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Homelessness in Anaheim: Scope of the Problem

- 11,962 calls for service (FY 2014/2015)
- Average time spent per call: 40 minutes
- Two officers are typically dispatched to each call for service, resulting in 80 minutes of police officer time per call
- Total time spent was approximately 956,960 minutes or 15,950 hours, occupying over 7 officers assigned full time to this issue per year



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A well-managed facility is key to maintaining public safety

Shelter Operations

- Coordinated intake system- no walk-up clients
- On-site Security Personnel who are well-trained and professional
- Collaboration and communication with APD staff
- Adherence to Shelter Rules



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Proactive Police Response

- APD Homeless Outreach Team working in partnership with Code Enforcement
- Dedicated to addressing homeless-related concerns and activity in the area surrounding the shelter facility
- Partnering with shelter staff to conduct neighborhood patrols and outreach efforts
- Responsive to Needs of Residents, Businesses, other stake holders



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Proactive Police Response

To effectively and proactively deliver coordinated response to potential crime and quality of life issues associated with the shelter facility and the surrounding area, the proposed Plan includes:

- Additional police officers to the Department's Homeless Outreach Team
- Additional code enforcement personnel resources



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Community Policing

Focused on crime prevention and long-term problem solving within a designated geographical area, CPT Officers work collaboratively with residents, business owners and other stake holders to address issues quickly and with the goal of enhancing the safety and quality of life throughout the assigned area

- The proposed plan includes additional personnel assigned to the East District Community Policing Team (CPT)



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Community Policing

Community Policing Officers will focus on addressing criminal behavior, neighborhood concerns and quality of life issues in the specific area surrounding the facility

- Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) techniques will be utilized:
 - Cameras
 - Parking
 - Signage
 - No Trespassing Letters
 - Dedicated telephone number and e-mail address
 - Removal of bulk items
 - Animal Control



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Patrol Response

- East District Patrol Officers will have the primary responsibility for responding to calls for service
- Strict enforcement of all applicable code and law violations to mitigate impact to surrounding area
- Coordinate services for those contacted in the field who are in need of assistance
- Proposed Plan includes additional Patrol resources



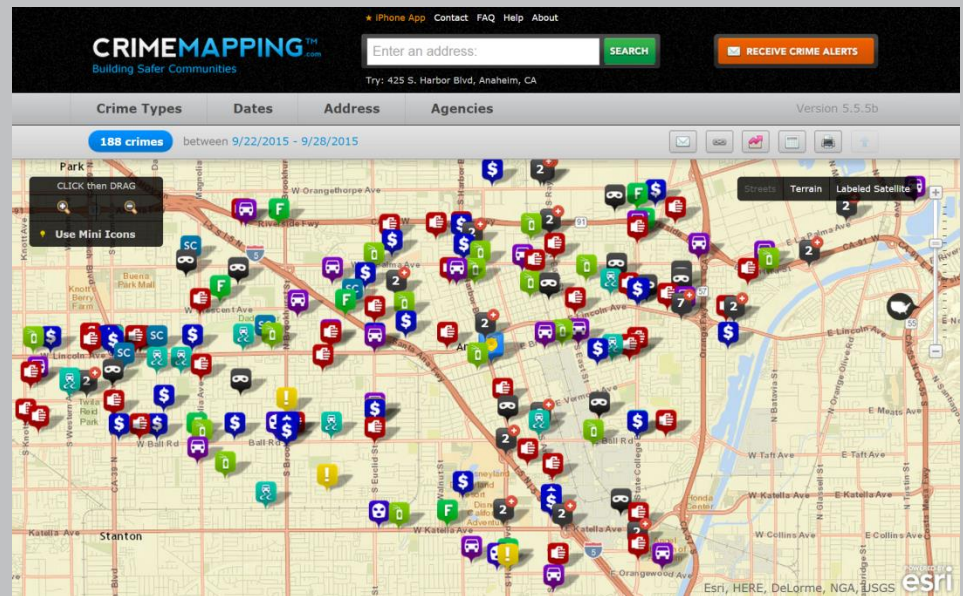
