HOW WE PERFORM

First agency in Orange County to implement Body Worn Cameras

UOF incidents are reported, investigated, tracked and audited

Advance Officer training using state of the art Force/De-Escalation Simulator (*Virtra*)

The use of Lexipol policies, which is a leader in content, policy and training platform for public safety



OUR NUMBERS

In 2020:

- Approximately **193,549** calls for service
- Of which, **15,062** citations were issued and **9,532** arrests. Of those arrests, **5,203** were housed in our detention facility
- **139** use of force/response to resistance
- **74** citizen complaints
- **3** OIS

RECOMMENDATIONS ON POLICE REFORM



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CHOKEHOLDS & STRANGLEHOLDS

- APD has never approved a choke or stranglehold
- APD has suspended the Carotid hold

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DE-ESCALATION

- APD has a robust de-escalation training program
- Partnership with Orange County Mental Health (PERT)

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WARNING BEFORE SHOOTING

- Both State law and our policy reflect that a warning before the application of lethal force should be given, when feasible

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EXHAUST ALL ALTERNATIVES BEFORE SHOOTING

- Officers shall use only that amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer at the time of the event

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DUTY TO INTERVENE

- APD commands any officer witnessing unreasonable force to stop that force and report the incident immediately

RECOMMENDATIONS ON POLICE REFORM



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BAN SHOOTING AT MOVING VEHICLES

- APD Policy forbids officers from shooting at vehicles unless there are no other ways to stop a threat faced by the officers or others

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USE OF FORCE CONTINUUM

- APD policy is based on the reasonableness of the force used by officers during the circumstances they faced by officers during the circumstances

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REQUIRE COMPREHENSIVE REPORTING

- APD practices a comprehensive reporting requirement mandating officers to document a variety of circumstances, including anytime an officer points a gun at anyone



PROPORTIONALITY

- APD use of force policy is based on “reasonableness” and proportionality is taken into consideration when determining reasonableness

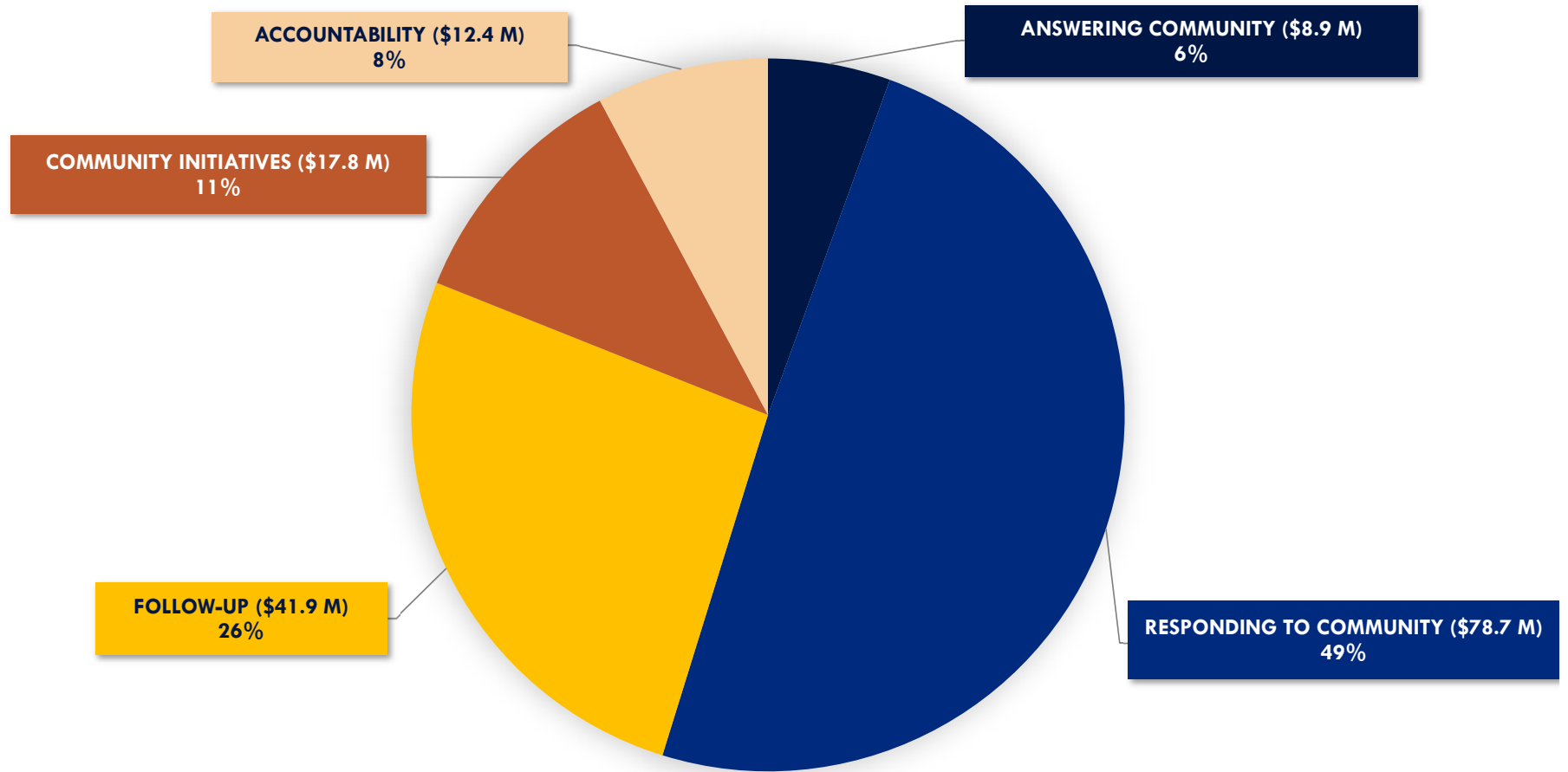
